OP claims:

- 1) Oceans are powerful, vast, relaxing and fun
- 2) Public unaware of ocean health, especially beyond beach
- 3) Protecting oceans is not urgent
- 4) Superficial knowledge of oceans and functions

5) Oceans are viewed as vulnerable, but public does not see individual actions as having great impact.

- 6) Low levels of personal importance on protecting oceans.
- 7) Emotions, not facts are correlated with concern for the ocean.
- 8) Convincing values: balance of nature, human survival
- 9) Messages: recreation, responsibility, future
- 10) Most salient threat: pollution
- 11) Americans may sacrifice to protect the oceans
